Confidentiality of National Redress Scheme material

The privacy and confidentiality of any material relating to allegations of child sexual abuse is extremely important, both to respect the needs and privacy of a person who discloses abuse, and to preserve the integrity of information which may be useful for any police investigation into allegations.

Information provided to and from an institution in relation to a Request For Information under the National Redress Scheme is 'protected information' under the *National Redress Scheme for Institutional Child Sexual Abuse Act 2018*. Information relating to a request should be stored securely and only be shared on a 'need to know' basis for the purposes of the Act – responding to the request for information, undertaking disciplinary processes or investigations, facilitating an insurance claim or providing a direct personal response. Before information is shared, consideration must be given to the impact the disclosure of information might have on the other person. If you need to make inquiries to respond to the RFI, you should share only necessary information.

There are criminal penalties for improper use of information.
